

Travel Authorization for F1 and J1 Visa Holders

F-1and J1 students are allowed to travel during Summer and semester breaks (including spring break, fall break, and holidays). The Office of International Affairs will not approve travel for students during the semester unless it meets the criteria for emergency travel. Please note that there mayobaetry specific travel restrictions in effe worldwide and in some places routine U.S. visa services have been suspended or delayed. Studenets who ar switching programs or transferring to another school do not require travel authorizations and will enter the U.S. with their new I-20If your visa is expired, delay travel until you have booked an appointment with enough time to renew your visa. Please note that airlinees und the world frequently cancel flights. Before returning to campus, please make sure to review CDC travel guid@heesenote that our staff cannotguaranteeyour reentry to the U.S.It is your responsibility ensure thatyou haveall documentsto enter the U.S.or any other country that you visit. Our office cannot provide advising on entry/exit for any country other than the Ut\$s important that students and scholars understand the risks of international travel. If you do decide to travel and are unable to reenter the U.S., yonay:

- x be unable to keep your assistantship (Graduate students cannot hold assistantships while outside) the
- x be unable to keep scholarships and/or-oampusemployment
- x be unable to complete your degreeogram
- x lose a semester of eligibility for OPT and COPT
- x owe rent even that you may be legally boundpary
- x be required to reapply for admission-Studentswho skip amajor term (Springor Fall), are required to apply for readmission
